### **Published Questions to manufacturers**

1. What products are now available or in the works that are intended for consumer energy conservation and are compliant with California Title 20?
2. Compared to the performance and cost of a full rated ¾ HP single speed pump, what products are available that will provide energy costs savings to the consumer?
3. Are there incentive or rebate programs available to the consumer or installer on these energy saving products?
4. What education programs are there for installers?
5. What education and advertising will be provided to help the consumer make a decision on what energy saving product to purchase?
6. What will be your warranty policy on the installation of non-compliant products?
7. What can IPSSA do to help you with energy conservation and consumer awareness?

### **Published Questions to distributors:**

1. What compliance information do you intend to have posted at your facilities?
2. Do you plan to provide formal training sessions for your staff on the requirements of Title 20?
3. How do you intend to reinforce Title 20 and the spirit of energy conservation?
4. Do you intend to post manufacturers warranty policies?
5. How has Title 20 affected your stocking practices?
6. How can IPSSA assist you in complying with Title 20?

### **Published Questions to energy providers:**

1. What information and in what form do you plan to notify your energy clients about the requirements of Title 20, regarding swimming pool pumps and replacement motors?
2. Do you plan to offer rebates or incentive programs to the consumer and installer?
3. Do you plan to require that the installer be a California licensed contractor to participate in an incentive or rebate program? If not, please explain.
4. Do you plan to provide a consumer "Hot Line" or website to answer consumer questions on the requirements of Title 20?
5. How can IPSSA be of help in regards to consumer awareness and compliance with the requirements of Title 20?

**Published Questions to California Energy Commission:**

1. Are there handouts, literature or posters available to manufacturers, distributors, retailers or installers to present to consumers that outline the requirements of Title 20?
2. Is there any reason to believe that there will be further regulation of swimming pool pumps and replacement motors in future amendments to Title 20?
3. Is there now available a Title 20 Compliance/Implementation Guideline Manual?
